
Emergency Food Pantry



Those in our service area receive a 3-day supply of food. (Zip codes 44301, 44307, 44308, 44311, 44320, 44321, and the Stow portion of 44224). In 2023, we distributed **900,000** pounds of food to over **65,000** participants, including a 3-day emergency supply to **33,012** adults and children.




Grab & Go Lunch/Meals



During the last two weeks of most months, OPEN M offers meals on weekdays, serving Summit County. OPEN M distributed 4,312 meals to persons in need in 2023.

Mountain of Food





Mountain of Food is a Direct Distribution program of the Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank hosted by OPEN M and is held the third Friday of every month. It is a one-day, bulk distribution of foods such as produce, meat, breads and more.

Pets

OPEN M's support of pets and pet ownership has grown significantly over the past three years. In 2022, we gave away **4,153** pounds of pet food. In 2023, that number grew to **12,780** pounds. In addition, the Humane Society of Summit County makes mobile visits to OPEN M with their MABEL Mobile Veterinary Clinic.

THE COST OF OWNING PETS HAS INCREASED OVER THE LAST FEW YEARS. VETERINARY CARE, GROOMING, FOOD AND OTHER EXPENSES ADD UP QUICKLY. A FORBES ADVISOR ANALYSIS FOUND THAT ESSENTIAL DOG EXPENSES COST AN AVERAGE OF \$1,533 ANNUALLY.

EMPLOYMENT SERVICES

Outreach Report

In 2023, OPEN M Employment Services continued its contracted partnership with Summit County Jobs and Family Services to facilitate the NEXT Program (Benefit Bridge). This program helps bridge the gap between needing government financial assistance and self-sufficiency for employed participants. OPEN M's contracted focus is peer mentoring to assist the participants with job retention and holistic well-being.







In 2023, Employment Services (ES) staff continued to passionately work together to help Community Works Akron (CWA) participants become more self-sufficient by securing sustainable and meaningful employment. Our ES Specialists partner with participants to develop an individualized path to employment. They help each participant with much needed hard and soft skills while connecting them with our more than 50 Employer Partners. ES also focused on helping participants remove and navigate other barriers such as transportation and childcare.

Employment Services has long-standing relationships with core employers throughout Summit County and continues to nurture those relationships while developing new ones. OPEN M's inaugural Job Fair took place in October 2023 where 33 partners shared job opportunities with over 60 community members seeking employment.

ES staff has also partnered with community organizations in alignment with OPEN M's mission to strengthen the community such as Citizen's Circle. Partnering with other nonprofit and community organizations allows ES to offer resources and expertise while building relationships.

57% of new job seeking participants were hired, a 16% increase from 2022.

Outcomes

The following successes were documented:

- ES served 223 participants.
- ES Staff maintained relationships with participants up to 12 months, with over 3,500 points of service.
- 57% of new job seeking participants were hired, a 16% increase from 2022.
- ES provided transportation with an ES vehicle, bus passes, fuel cards and a car was donated to a participant thanks to a generous donor.
- Inaugural Job Fair to serve community job seekers was a success. 43
 Employer Partners offered job opportunities and 66 job seekers attended. A final count of those hired is in process.
- ES hired one NEXT program participant and provided internship opportunities to students.




